CITIZENS AND TAXPAYERS

Ms. Joyce Uram, 37 Schley Street, asked questions concerning a proposed new police station.

COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS

Councilmember Raymond said that Garfield YMCA Community Day held on Saturday, September 11, 2010, was a great success. She said that her grandson had a ball and that there were all kinds of things for kids to do, and it was a very nice event. She said that she was disappointed with how the animals were being cared for at the petting zoo at Community Day, but other than that, it was a great success and she was really happy that the event turned out so good.

Councilmember Delaney said he wanted to publicly thank the County Executive and the County Board of Chosen Freeholders because without their financial support, the Riverfront project would not be possible. He said that he supports changing the Municipal Elections from May to November to save the City money and increase voter turnout. He said that he wanted to attend and participate in the Tank Pull that was held on September 12<sup>th</sup> in Clifton, using the City of Garfield army vehicle in Columbus Park, which raised about \$70,000.00 for the Wounded Warrior fundraiser, but he had to attend another affair.

Councilmember Aloia gave credit to every Councilmember from the 1970's to now who maintained the concept of what is going to happen on River Drive in the very near future. He congratulated everyone at the table for an outstanding job for an idea nurtured for about thirty years. He commended everybody for all their hard work and their vision for the town. He spoke on the Walmart Redevelopment off Passaic Street and Lincoln Place and he spoke on the Signature Place at Garfield/Garden State Paper Redevelopment at 950 River Drive. He said that he is glad to be a part of it.

Deputy Mayor Moskal said that if you read newspaper articles about other municipalities and all the challenges going on and compare it to the amount of activity going on in Garfield with the Garden State Paper Redevelopment and the Walmart Redevelopment and this riverfront park coming to fruition, it is amazing and something of which all our residents should be proud that there is progress and things are happening in the City of Garfield. He said that people should be excited about it. He expressed thanks and gratitude to each and every person who reached out to him with nice thoughts and wishes and prayers on the birth of his daughter, Sarah, who is now a month and three days old. He said that there will not be a Pulaski Day Parade in Garfield this year because of all the events going on in New York City for Garfield this year. He said that there will be a mass in Saint Patrick's Cathedral and then a small breakfast and then the Parade will kickoff up Fifth Avenue in New York City. He said that Garfield is the first contingent of the Parade since he is the Grand Marshall of the Parade for the entire Tri-State area. He said that there is a need for a strong showing because it is one opportunity for Garfield to lead the Parade for all these states. He said that it will be a great day for the City of Garfield.

Mayor Calandriello said that this definitely is a historic event for the City of Garfield. He spoke on all the great things happening in the City of Garfield and he said that many people have put in a lot of hours in getting things done and sometimes it makes you wonder where Garfield would be if not for the recession. He said that the Garden State Paper Redevelopment would probably be fully developed and complete and the Vornado/South Garfield Redevelopment off Passaic Street would probably have all the parcels developed already besides Walmart and Applebee's, but the City is

still moving forward. He congratulated the Austin Family because Miles Austin of Garfield, who plays NFL football as a wide receiver for the Dallas Cowboys, just signed a \$57 million, 6 year contract extension and Miles Austin is one of the best receivers in the NFL right now. He said that it was a good week for the Austin Family and the City of Garfield.
