ORDINANCES

Councilmember Aloia introduced in writing the following ordinance entitled:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, CHAPTER 249 OF THE
CODE OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD ENTITLED
“RECYCLING”

City Clerk Pavlica read the ordinance by title.

Councilmember Aloia moved that this entitled ordinance entitled: “AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND, CHAPTER 249 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF GARFIELD ENTITLED “RECYCLING””, do now pass on first reading and remain on file with the City Clerk for public inspection until public hearing thereon and further consideration thereof which shall be held on June 23, 2009 at 8:00 PM in the City Hall in Garfield and that the City Clerk shall be directed to publish said ordinance in full together with the notice of such hearing in the Garfield Messenger, at least seven days prior to the hearing.

The motion, duly seconded by Councilmember Raymond, was on roll call adopted by the following vote and the motion was declared adopted and said ordinance passed on first reading: Ayes 4, Absent 1 – Mayor Calandriello

PRESENTATION OF PROPOSED NEW TRAIN STATION

City Manager Duch displayed and explained plans and artist renderings of a proposed new Plauderville Train Station between Outwater Lane and Midland Avenue.

CITIZENS AND TAXPAYERS

Ms. Laura Danis, 33 Spring Street, complained about lights remaining on late into the night at the Little League Field in Belmont Oval Park. She spoke on the Security Lights in the Parking Lot and asked if a filter can be placed over the lights. She spoke on the hours that the mowing of the Little League field and the leveling of the infield dirt by the Parks employees takes place.

Mr. Ignatius Tripodi, 155 Malcolm Avenue, asked about the Garden State Paper Redevelopment and when a new Police Station would be built for the City by the developer. He asked about the Vornado/South Garfield Redevelopment off Passaic Street. He asked about the application by the City for Urban Enterprise Zone designation.

Mr. Marino Binetti, 14 Steinberg Avenue, spoke on a City Revaluation of properties.

Ms. Hilde Sdoutz and Ms. Sara Antes, both of 124 Grand Street, complained about their neighbors drinking, fighting, partying and being inconsiderate late into the night.

Mr. Khaldoun Androwls, 490 Madeline Avenue, Mr. Thum Coppola, 493 Madeline Avenue, and Ms. Issa C. Shabo, 488 Madeline Avenue, complained about buses and trucks traveling down Madeline Avenue, jumping the curb, knocking down signs and hitting telephone poles. Mr. Androwls requested a guard rail at his property.

Ms. Sylva Pokrzywa, 10 Steinberg Avenue, complained about patrons of the Midnight Sun Tavern located at 323 Semel Avenue. She spoke on incidents where there have been people urinating on the fence, loud cursing and fights. She suggested a check point in the area because she said that there are a lot of vehicle accidents, involving ambulances and fire trucks.

Mr. William Whren, 33 Westminster Place, spoke on handicapped people driving motorize carts in the public street, rather than on the public sidewalks.

COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS

Councilmember Raymond said that with summer coming, more problems will be seen. She said that she likes the idea of a Police Bicycle Unit or a walking beat. She said that Type A Flu was discovered in the City schools. She said that all the schools were sanitized and she complimented City Public Health Nurse Darlene Reveille for her response to the matter. She said that the Relay for Life Cancer Prevention Fundraiser will be held this Saturday to Sunday at Twentieth Century Field. She wished Deputy Mayor Moskal a "Happy Birthday".

Councilmember Delaney said that tonight was a very good meeting and that people came up because they cared about their neighborhood. He said that by coming here to the Council meeting and bringing issues to the Council's attention, the problems can be resolved. He said that it was good to see concerned citizens here at the meeting. He spoke on the City website located at www.GARFIELDNJ.ORG. He spoke on the Boilermaker 5K Race to benefit Project Graduation and the Garfield YMCA which was held Sunday, May 31st. He said that Deputy Mayor Moskal did a wonderful job, on his birthday, filling in for the Mayor.

Councilmember Aloia spoke on the upcoming Relay for Life event occurring this weekend, and the Cole Brothers Circus coming to town this week at Garfield High School to benefit PBA Local No. 46. He spoke on the good job of the organizers of the 5K race held on May 31st. He said that if the Council did something quickly or right or wrong, to please come back to the Council meeting because when the public takes possession of the issues that is when whoever else is bad does not take possession. He said that the more people who get involved with an issue, the easier it is to solve it. He said that even when the position seems to be a simple one, it may not be. He said that if the Council does not have input from the citizens and people taking possession of the issues, bad things happen by bad people. He spoke on the issue of lights and carelessness at Belmont Oval park off Spring Street. He spoke on the millions of dollars spent to put in a brand new astro turf field in Belmont Oval, and yet people destroy it by smoking cigarettes and dropping the lit butts onto the field. He said that everyone on the Council tries to do their very best and sometimes there are more people trying to make it worse than good people trying to make it better. He said that the more good people who get involved, the better. He wished Deputy Mayor Moskal a "Happy Birthday".

Deputy Mayor Moskal said that tonight was a wonderful discussion and dialogue. He said that the public should be the eyes and ears so the Council can perform the actions to move forward to make Garfield a better City. He spoke on the City website at www.GARFIELDNJ.ORG. He spoke on quality of life issues and said that it is an important issue. He said that quality of life is a dynamic topic and a few years ago, the City was facing the issue of bars closing at 3 o'clock in the morning in Garfield, while other towns required their bars to close at 2 o'clock in the morning. He said that the Council addressed it and made closing time for bars at 2 o'clock in the morning to prevent drunk drivers from driving into Garfield to drink. He spoke on the Curfew Ordinance and perhaps bringing it up again concerning enforcement and trying to come up with creative ideas. He thanked his Mom and sister for being here tonight at the Council Meeting on his birthday. He spoke on the various events held in town recently and those that are coming up.
