A Resolution Authorizing M-2 Associates Inc. and the City Engineer to Provide Hydrogeologic and Engineering Services in Connection With The Reactivation of Wells 1A, 1R and 2R.

WHEREAS, the City of Garfield has recently received a permit to construct pump and treatment facilities for Well 1A which is conditioned upon further testing upon completion of said improvements in order to secure the required permit to operate from NJDEP, and;

WHEREAS, nearby Wells 1 and 2 have been out of service in excess of 20 years but remain as active wells pursuant to the City's Water Allocation Permit, and;

WHEREAS, Wells 1 and 2 were originally constructed in the 1920's and do not comply with current NJDEP Bureau of Safe Drinking Water standards and consequently must either be permanently sealed or replaced with a replacement well in order to retain the allocations identified within the City's Water Allocation Permit, and;

WHEREAS, NJDEP requirements dictate the construction of a replacement well must proceed the sealing of an existing well in order to be considered as a replacement well, and;

WHEREAS, the City's long term objective is to return the replacement wells for either one or both of these wells to active service following the successful reactivation of Well 1A.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, M-2 Associates Inc. is hereby authorized to perform the services outlined in their proposal dated August 7, 2014 in an amount not to exceed \$86,925 and the

At 9:00 PM, Councilmember Delaney left the meeting. It was duly noted for the record.

CITIZENS AND TAXPAYERS

Mr. Charles Nucifora, 126 Midland Avenue, congratulated the Mayor and Council for recognizing Superior Court Judge Patrick Roma on his retirement. He presented a list of all the days and times at home that he smelled “garbage odor” from the Solid Waste Transfer Station at 19-35 Atlantic Street. He complained about the paths that the trucks travel to the Transfer Station. He said that sixty-four County summonses have been issued and the Garfield Police Department have issued one hundred-twenty-four summonses.

Ms. Helena Plaskon, 88 Roehs Drive, Wallington, New Jersey spoke on losing her job with the Garfield School System and spoke on the performance of Mayor Raymond.

Mr. John Easom, 103 Gaston Avenue, said that the transfer station company he used to work with years ago used Zyne-Tich which is an enzyme based neutralizer for salvage treatment plants. He spoke on hiring code enforcement officers to take the load off the Police Department. He said that he has noticed there are more commercial vehicles parking over night in town.

Mr. Settimo “Sam” DiFresco, 490 VanBussum Avenue, complimented the DPW. He complained about noise pollution. He complained about what is happening in his neighborhood. He complained about the problem he is having with his neighbor and a retaining wall that he is afraid may collapse onto his property.

COUNCILMEMBER COMMENTS

Councilmember Calandriello congratulated Garfield High School Head Football Coach Jeff DeVito and his football staff on the fine performance they are getting from their players. He said that Garfield High School played a great game this past weekend and they won in overtime. He complimented Police Detective Sean Delahanty, Sergeant Michael Marsh and Sergeant Joseph Delaney for breaking up a fight of about ten to twelve young men getting out of control. He said that they disbanded the fight and made an arrest or two. He said that he checks his emails and does not ignore them. He said that he did not get an update from the City Attorney to set up a meeting and find out why this happened but there was nothing to report. He spoke on the five minute rule for the public to speak.

Councilmember Aloia said that he wanted to make mention how much cleaner Passaic Street is. He spoke on property maintenance issues. He said that there is a hole in the handicapped ramp that

PSE&G installed on Palisade Avenue and Passaic Street. He said that he had the opportunity to stand at the Lodi Stadium for a tag day for the Charter School in Garfield. They collected \$2,600.00 for Project Graduation. He thanked everyone for their support.

Councilmember Mati said that the new mall and WaWa at River Drive and Outwater Lane is under construction. He said that years ago, the Garfield Middle School students formed a Peace sign that was photographed from above the building. He said that this week they were going to make a giant number 2 and send it to the New York Yankees in recognition of the retirement of the Captain Derek Jeter.

Mayor Raymond said that Public Health Nurse Darleen Revielle was awarded a Christine Armenti Scholarship. She spoke on the great job that she does and said that she is very active in our community. She said that the next Council meeting will be televised. She said that there was an incident in the Alternative School in Clifton where a child created a tense situation but she is very proud of Sergeant John Lesica and Patrolman James Zangara for the way they handled themselves. She said that she would be writing a letter to the Police Chief in regard to the incident to put in their personnel files. She said that the Garfield Animal Rescue Foundation car wash fundraiser collected almost \$600.00.
